PARISH FOOD PANTRY



It has been wonderful welcoming so many new people to our community, and to see the full return of our parishioners of many years. **Following the 9:30am and 11:00am Masses this weekend, we will have an Open House** so that people can see the good work that has been done since the April flood damaged 19 spaces on the first and second floor. You also can visit the **renovated St. Joseph Courtyard** and enjoy some goodies there. Our Administrative Coordinator, Nancy, will be on hand in her office so that volunteers can fill out the CORI forms; she is also there to answer any questions!!

I want to remind everyone that our Faith Formation Program is getting ready to begin. Children (including First Confession and First Communion), Confirmation for 9th and 10th grade High Schoolers, college students and adults, and RCIA (for those wishing to become Catholic) should be in contact with the various Directors, noted in our bulletin and on the web-site.

With so many Masses and other sacraments celebrated each week at St. Paul's, that is a serious number of purificators, corporals, and towels! Thank you, Sue!

During the Covid months, we were able to do some great upgrading of our Family/Cry Room just across the bridgeway. Not only is there new artwork, but most importantly, there is a high-definition screen with a live feed of the Mass in the church. This is a great help to many families, and we are happy to make it available to them.

Please mark your calendar for our annual **OKTOBERFEST**, which will take place at **6:00pm, Saturday, September 25**. We are happy to have volunteers for set up, serving, and other needs. Let me know if you can help, and I will point you in the right direction!

We have dozens of people who visit our church every day, and that doesn't include those attending Mass! Next weekend, at the 11:00am Mass, Bishop McManus of Worcester will join us to celebrate the Mass of the Holy Spirit, when we ask God's blessing on the Choir School and Harvard as we begin another academic year. I should also add that Cambridge that day will have one of its many road races; access to St. Paul's will still be possible, but give yourself plenty of extra time!
