OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Dear Friends,

As ever, the holidays seem to leap upon us, so allow me to wish you a happy and blessed **Thanksgiving**. This year continues to have some challenges with gathering and traveling, but I hope it will be a good day. I invite you to join us for Mass that morning at 9:00am, which is certainly a wonderful way to put thanks in its proper perspective! There is also some assistance for those in need of food for Thanksgiving. Please see the bulletin or website for information.

I also want to thank all those who participated in last week's **Requiem Mass** and the lecture about Faure's great work which preceded it. What a fitting and stirring way to remember and pray for our loved ones who have died.

This weekend, we celebrate the beautiful **Solemnity of Christ the King**, the final Sunday of Ordinary Time in the Church's liturgical calendar. It is a fitting summation of the worship we offer Almighty God each Sunday, and every moment.

Following the 11:00am Mass, at **12:30pm**, we will also have the moving **Investiture Service** for those choir school boys who have completed their preparation as full members of the Choristers. They will officially be "invested" with surplice and hymnal and offer their promise of service to God with the gift of their voices. For this reason, the "school song" (in our case, Gregorian Chant!!), begins: "Repleatur os meum laude tua...Let my lips be filled with Your praise." The ceremony lasts a half hour, and all are most welcome to join.

Which brings us to next week's start of Advent and December activities. We are happy to once again host **Advent Community meals** on the first three Wednesdays of December, beginning Dec. 1. These welcome our homeless brothers and sisters and those seeking a common meal together to join in the lower church at 12:30pm. You are welcome to volunteer your time on those days and/or to make a financial contribution through the parish office. We will also begin our **Giving Tree project** to provide Christmas gifts for local families; again, please see the bulletin or website for more information. We also have **Solemn Sung Advent Vespers at 5:30pm in the church on Thursday**. Please join us! Thanks to all those helping with these initiatives!

Our famous **Christmas concerts** offered by our Choir School will be live and in person this year! Concerts are **Sundays December 12 and 19, both at 3:00pm**. Tickets are available through the Choir School website or by calling the school office. Not only is this a tremendous way to celebrate the holidays, but it also supports the school and its mission of bringing sacred music to the area, and to the world.

Last weekend, at our second collection, we began our very important **Parish Grand Annual Appeal**.
